Comments on DRBC Water Resources Program with regard to drilling in the DRB, referencing page 31 of the Water Resources Program for year 2017 through 2019

I am submitting the <u>Amicus brief</u> and <u>exhibits</u> we (Damascus Citizens for Sustainability) filed in the Wayne Land and Mineral Group lawsuit against the DRBC as a comment referencing page 31 of the Water Resources Program for year 2017 through 2019. We filed this Amicus on the human health impacts of fracking in support of the DRBC. These impacts clearly show ample reason why the practice should NOT be allowed to be done in the Delaware River Basin (DRB).
